The Ivy League and Patriot League jointly announced today the hiring of Jim Maconaghy as the Coordinator of Football Officiating for both Leagues, beginning with the 2004 season. Maconaghy, who had more than two decades of on-field experience as a collegiate referee, adds his new duties to those as the coordinator of officials for the Atlantic 10 Football Conference, which he has done since he retired from officiating in 2000.

"Jim impressed the joint Ivy League and Patriot League committee with a very systematic year-round approach to the training and development of officials," said Patriot League Executive Director Carolyn Schlie Femovich. "He is highly respected by coaches, officials and athletic administrators in collegiate football for his technical and administrative abilities. He will add consistency in the training and development of officials as well as the evaluation of their on-field performance evaluation."

Maconaghy, who lives in Plymouth Meeting, Pa., worked as a referee in all three Leagues, as well as the Yankee Conference and the Big East Conference, from 1986 to 2000. Prior to that, he was a referee on the NCAA Division II and III levels for seven seasons, beginning in 1979.
